

The Congress Dinner will be in one of the major tourist attractions in Stockholm, the Ship Hall of the Vasa Museum on the island of Djurgården.

The Vasa ship was constructed in the 1620's, but sank on its maiden voyage in 1632 in the middle of Stockholm harbour after sailing barely 1300 meters. It was salvaged in the 1960's and the present Vasa Museum was opened in 1990.

The collections in the museum include more than 40 000 objects that were found in and around the ship. Among the objects are equipment and decorative elements from the ship as well as personal belongings of the crew, different types of weapons, tools and coins. The objects and ship give a unique picture of everyday life at sea and on land, and of shipbuilding techniques and nautical warfare in the early 1600s.

The dinner fee includes a guided tour of the museum before the dinner, a welcome drink and a three-course dinner with two glasses of wine. After the dinner, the bar and restaurant is booked for us. There will be a band playing and opportunity for dancing.
